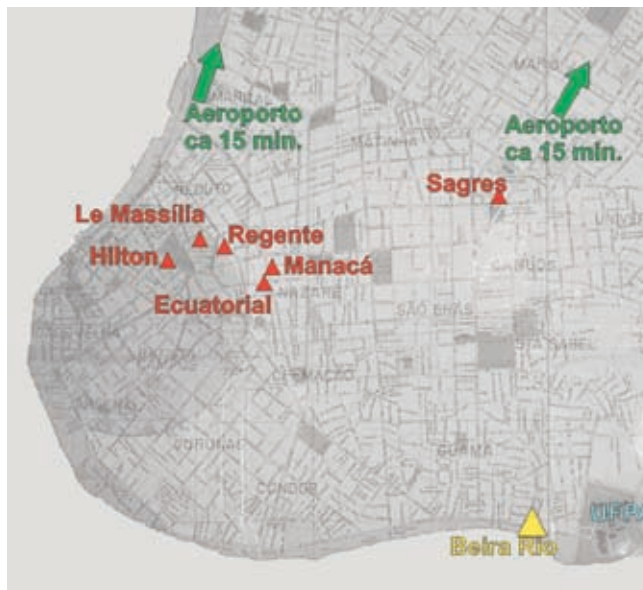

Against the background of changing settlement structures in Amazonia, the implementation of regional sustainable development becomes an increasing challenge for science, politics and planning. Sustainable settlement patterns are an indispensable precondition for the conservation of resources and the battle against poverty in this region.

The superior aim of the SUSAM-project, which is supported by the European Commission, is the development of adjusted strategy concepts and regulation instruments for a sustainable regional development in the Amazon region. Therefore the dialogue between application-oriented science, politics, planning and regional interest groups will be of central significance.

The formation of the multilateral and interdisciplinary network »Sustainable Amazonia« is an integral part of the SUSAM-project. The SUSAM-network consist of academic institutions and NGOs from Brazil, Bolivia and the EU, which all have a long experience in research, politics or planning on the Amazon region:
