The Collaborative Research Centre (SFB 1070) "ResourceCultures – Sociocultural Dynamics and the Use of Resources" addresses the subjects of resources with an innovative and interdisciplinary perspective. While resources commonly are defined as naturally occurring raw-materials such as soil, water, gas and oil the primary aim of the Collaborative Research Centre is to investigate social processes relating to the use of resources world-wide and through all periods of human history. - **A. DEVELOPMENTS:** Resources and Processes of Social Change.
- **B. MOVEMENTS:** Resources and Spatial Development.
- **C. VALUATIONS:** Resources and the Symbolic Dimensions of Cultures.




