TOWN OF TÜBINGEN

Tübingen does not have a university, it is a university. The picturesque historical town center and its attractive position on the Neckar River offer a high quality of life whether you are studying, working, or taking a break.

Located at the heart of Europe

Located in Baden-Württemberg, a southern German region with strong European traditions, Tübingen is close to Strasbourg, France, seat of the European Parliament, and equally close to Frankfurt, seat of the European Central Bank. Stuttgart airport nearby serves many international destinations, putting Tübingen just a stone's throw away from cities in Europe like Paris, London and Barcelona.

Close to Stuttgart – a high-tech region

Stuttgart, the capital of Baden-Württemberg, can be reached in just 30 minutes by train. With over 5 million inhabitants, the Stuttgart Metropolitan Region is one of the biggest in Germany. Home to companies such as Bosch, Daimler and Porsche, it has been a center of technological innovation for over a century. Stuttgart has very good rail connections, putting it just a few hours away from Munich, Berlin and Hamburg.

- Buddy Program: A student from the University of Tübingen supports you before and during your stay in Tübingen. The Buddy Program promotes intercultural exchange and will allow you to get to know German student life first-hand.

You will visit Strasbourg, Berlin and Stuttgart, take a tour of the European Parliament, interview EU-politicians, and visit influential companies in the economically strong region of Baden-Württemberg.

Admission

The summer schools are designed for undergraduate and graduate students with different academic backgrounds interested in a general introduction to International & European Studies. Students must be at least 18 years old.

Number of Places: 24

Credits and Transcript

After successful completion of the courses, students will obtain ECTS credits and will receive a certificate of attendance and an official transcript.

Summer School I:	8 ECTS credits
Summer School II:	12 ECTS credits

Accommodation

Participants will be housed in a University residence hall or in selected host families. There is free internet access in the accommodation as well as on campus.

Program fee

Summer School I:	2,000 Euro (early bird: 1,600 Euro)
Summer School II:	2,800 Euro (early bird: 2,400 Euro)

Fees cover costs for courses, study trips, accommodation, many social activities and a bus ticket in Tübingen.
