



◆ History of Kyushu University about Metal-oxide-based Gas Sensors In 1962, Prof. Seiyama proposed a gas detection device using ZnO, and the laboratory began the research on gas sensors. His work was continued by Prof. Yamazoe and Prof. Shimanoe, who developed concepts for designing materials for high-performance gas sensors.
