Scope

Biblische Zeitschrift (BZ) founded in 1903, is one of the leading international journals in Biblical Studies. Contributions are published in German, English and French. The primary aim of the journal is to further the understanding of the Biblical texts, both of the Old and the New Testament. Articles focus on philological or text-critical issues, raise questions of historical and cultural contextualisation or concentrate on literary, hermeneutical or theological issues – to name only a few of the relevant aspects. Each volume also contains book reviews to help scholars as well as everyone interested in Biblical Studies to keep informed in the ever-developing field of study.

Ethical and Legal Conditions

The publication of a manuscript in a peer-reviewed work is expected to follow standards of ethical behavior for all parties involved in the act of publishing: authors, editors, and reviewers. Submission Requirements

Language

Biblische Zeitschrift publishes articles in German, English, and French. Contributions should be grammatically correct and in good literary style. All spelling should be consistent.

Font

Ordinary Roman style text Arial and Times New Roman that come with Microsoft Windows are fine. For extended characters, authors should ensure that they use a Unicode friendly font such as the Brill (brill.com/about/brill-fonts).

Unicode and Non-Roman Fonts

The Editors request the use of Unicode fonts only.

Updated versions of Times New Roman in Microsoft Windows contain Greek and Hebrew Unicode fonts. The Society of Biblical Literature has produced Hebrew and Greek Unicode fonts. The Hebrew comes with keyboard driver. They are available at: sbl-site.org/educational/BiblicalFonts SBLHebrew.aspx. If you have any questions about fonts or any other issue, please contact the editors.

Manuscript Structure

General

Please send your text by e-mail attached as a Word document and as a PDF file to the respective editor. Please indicate your institutional connection (with address) and your e-mail address.

Format the text as little as possible (no heading formatting; no justification; no separations). The footnote characters are set after punctuation.

Abstract and Keywords

All manuscripts should be accompanied by an abstract in English of no more than 150 words and a list of no more than six or seven keywords.

Abbreviations

Abbreviations of biblical books should be according to the Loccumer guidelines. The verses are always connected with comma, additional verses with dot: 1 Kön 12,1f.12-27.

Simple "f." can be used, please do not use "ff.". Please write the abbreviations "V." and "f." with a period ("V." for verse and verses), as well as all generally used English and German abbreviations: e.g., A.D., etc., z.B., z.T., 1.Jh.n.Chr., usw. Use common exegetical abbreviations such as atl, ntl, dtr, pln, Mk-Ev, however, without a full stop.

Abbreviations of journals, serials, encyclopaedias, etc. should follow S. Schwertner, IATG3 (2016). Abbreviations of Apocrypha, Pseudepigrapha, inter testamentary literature, Philo, Josephus, Qumran, rabbinic literature according to the common list of abbreviations of the TRE or the RGG (but 4 Esr, 3 Makk, 2 Clem, etc.). Greek-Roman literature and church fathers according to the ThWNT (Tac., Ann XIV 15,5). Nag Hammadi Codices in German according to K. W. Tröger (ed.), Altes Testament - Frühjudentum - Gnosis, Gütersloh 1980, 16-18; in English according to *The Nag Hammadi Library*, in French according to *Bibliothèque Copte de Nag Hammadi*.

Reference List

General:

- In the first citation all bibliographical details are to be mentioned. In subsequent references ise short titles and back references in the following form:
 - K. Schmid, Schöpfung (s. Anm. 12) 43-47.
- In the case of a publishing house with several publishing places (de Gruyter, Herder), only mention the first city. For two or more publishers use slashes, e.g. OBO.
- City names: Frankfurt a.M., Freiburg i.Br., Freiburg (Switzerland) for Freiburg i.Ue.
- After city names in the USA, add the official abbreviation of the respective federal state with a comma (see RGG⁴ [2007] VI); e.g. Louisville, KY 2003.

When citing a reference for the first time, always indicate all page numbers, then special pages if necessary (in all languages with comma). Citations should conform to the following format.

Publication

Proofs

Upon acceptance, a PDF of the article proofs will be sent to authors by e-mail to check carefully for factual and typographic errors. Authors are responsible for checking these proofs and are strongly urged to make use of the Comment & Markup toolbar to note their corrections directly on the proofs. At this stage in the production process, only minor corrections are allowed. Alterations to the original manuscript at this stage will result in considerable delay in publication and, therefore, are not accepted unless charged to the author. Proofs should be returned promptly to the editors.

E-Offprints

A PDF file of the article will be supplied free of charge by the publisher to each author. Brill is a RoMEO yellow publisher.

Authors are allowed to post their submitted (pre-peer-review) version of the article at any time. This is the author's own version that had not yet been peer-reviewed, or had any value added to it by Brill (such as formatting or copy editing). Authors may post the accepted (peer-reviewed) version of their article 12 months after publication. This is the version accepted for publication, which contains all revisions made after peer review and copy editing, but has not yet been typeset in the publisher's lay-out. The publisher's lay-out must not be used in any repository or on any website.

Consent to Publish

Transfer of Copyright

By submitting a manuscript, the author agrees that the copyright for the article is transferred to the publisher if and when the article is accepted for publication. For that purpose, the author needs to sign the **Consent to Publish** which will be sent with the first proofs of the manuscript.

Open Access

Should the author wish to publish the article in **Open Access** he/she can choose the **Brill Open** option. This allows for non-exclusive Open Access publication under a Creative Commons license in exchange for an Article Publication Charge (APC), upon signing a special **Brill Open Consent to Publish** Form.
