

# Evaluation criteria for the tenure-track professorship "Ethics in the Sciences and Humanities".

Criteria marked with an asterisk (\*) are mandatory qualification characteristics

## A. Research

Publications*	<p>7 articles in qualified relevant journals (accepted or published). further substantial individual articles total: about 10 articles</p> <p>Proof that the total number of finished manuscripts (published, submitted or not yet submitted) is approximately equivalent to the requirements for habilitation</p> <p>Proof of scientific publications or manuscripts ready for publication in at least one additional subject area different from to the dissertation.</p> <p><i>For the interim evaluation: 5 finished manuscripts / conference papers, research plan for the achievement of the publication goal</i></p>
Scientific lectures*	approx. 2 conference contributions per year
Research projects*	<p>Development and establishment of an independent research programme.</p> <p>The research programme includes cross-cutting topics and projects that take into account and take up the topics and research interests of the Ethics Centre.</p> <p><i>For the interim evaluation: visible establishment of the research programme</i></p>
Third-party funds*	<p>Independent acquisition of extramural third-party funds:</p> <p>“Independent” means: As the sole or principal investigator responsible for a project or sub-project, i.e. not: joint project or sub-project with a more experienced or equally experienced project leader within the university. Joint projects with representatives of other universities are possible.</p> <p>“Extramural” means: external third-party funding sources for which internal review procedures do not play a role.</p> <p>Third-party funded projects include not only research projects that provide research money for personnel but also: an own research fellowship or similar models, for academic leave of absence without remuneration by the university within the framework of a junior professorship, larger third-party funds for guest professorships/fellowships (e.g. Humboldt), third party funds for larger conferences.</p> <p><i>For the interim evaluation: 2 submissions or specific submission plans</i></p> <p>Collaboration in the application and support of high-level projects (e. g. research groups, Research Training Groups, graduate schools, etc.)</p>

	<p><i>For the interim evaluation: 1 joint proposal or specific proposal plan submitted for the interim evaluation.</i></p> <p>Serious and high-quality submissions; if under unfortunate circumstances none of the applications were accepted, this does not per se mean that this evaluation criterion is missed.</p>
Scientific cooperations	<p>Intensive and equal interdisciplinary cooperation in the planning of a publication or in the context of a research project as well as through own lectures, conferences, etc.</p> <p><i>For the interim evaluation: proof of appropriate cooperation</i></p> <p><i>For the final evaluation: proof of ongoing activities in this area.</i></p>
(Co-)Organization of symposia	<p>Conceptual work is expected at the Ethics Centre's interdisciplinary symposia (e. g. Tübingen Symposium on Ethics).</p>
Expert activity	<p>Reviewer activities for relevant thematic journals</p>
PHD	<p>PhD supervisions.</p> <p>Main supervision and, if applicable, a completed dissertation in an expected period of time must only be proven if the junior professorship is provided with doctoral position; otherwise, co-supervision of PhD-candidates (reports, PhD- colloquia) is sufficient.</p>

## B. Teaching

Lectures, seminars, etc.*	<p>Until the end of the junior professorship, it is expected that the spectrum of courses offered will meet the requirements of the subsequent W3 professorship.</p> <p>This also means teaching on special topics that are beyond the main research areas of the call for bachelor's and master's degree courses.</p>
Supervised final theses (Bachelor, Master, Staatsexamen, Diplom, Magister)	<p>Supervision of MA and BA theses.</p> <p>After 6 years, the supervision of MA that are not within the own narrow research area.</p> <p><i>For the interim evaluation: completed BA and MA theses</i></p>
Student course evaluation *	<p>2 outstandingly successful evaluations of teaching results.</p>

## C. Akademische Selbstverwaltung

Self-governing bodies	<p>The Junior Professor is a member of the IZEW Scientific Council and fulfils the corresponding tasks. With the transfer to a W3 professorship, the Full Professor will play a decisive role in the management of the IZEW (Board of Directors, Spokesperson).</p>
Takeover of tasks in the IZEW	<p>It is expected that internal tasks of the institution (personnel management, organization) are being resumed</p>
