Background

For almost ten years, a rich and productive disciplinary exchange within the field of English literature has existed between the Universities of Strasbourg (France) and Tübingen. At first, this was strongly focused on Early Modern Studies, which goes back to regular staff mobility exchanges through Erasmus+ between the chairs for literature from the times of Shakespeare. These joint endeavours have been followed conference contributions and participation in doctoral colloquia/defences. Since 2021, an annual colloquium has been added to the spectrum of collaborative efforts between the two universities that is open to MA and PhD students. The scope of research interests has also been widened since then - now including nineteenth-century studies as well - and so has the overall scope of participation: The Université de Haute Alsace in Mulhouse has recently joined the programme and will participate in this summer's colloquium for the first time.

In June, four doctoral students from France will present their work in a one-day colloquium at Tübingen, joined by two doctoral students from Tübingen. They will be accompanied by their supervisors and spend the day with academic discussion and critical debate.


